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As a dental hygiene student, I have worked primarily with a preset arrangement of instruments. The school I attend uses a popular stainless steel line of instruments. One of my instructors had access to the XP² Glacier line from American Eagle Instruments and was able to let me try the instrument during the clinic, as well as the original XP. The XP² Glacier made a huge difference.

I was able to use the Blackjack as well as the H6/7, which was a vastly different design from the instruments I have been using. The handle made it easier to have more control, as well as being much lighter in weight. I was able to immediately tell the difference in sharpness. The sharpness made it easier to remove tenacious calculus and left me with less fatigue after treatment. When I get into private practice, the XP2 Glacier line, especially the Blackjack and H6/7, are instruments I want in my cassette.
